1	Empower Communities to Build Schools Where Students Thrive Simple-majority school bonds and fairer access to state construction money.	
2	Strategic Investments to Improve Student Outcomes Stable district budgets, closed funding gaps, restored cuts.	
3	Fund Climate-Ready Schools: Clean Air, Heat-Safe HVAC, filtration and cooling in school buildings, paid for with Climate Commitment Act revenue.	
4	Ensuring Literacy & Math Proficiency for All Students Early learning, funded intervention, evidence-based reading and math instruction.	
5	Addressing Funding, Inclusion, and Support in Special Education Full funding, enough staff, real inclusion, fairer identification and discipline.	
6	Addressing the Student Mental Health Crisis More counselors and therapists, lower ratios, support for families and educators.	
7	Keep Students Safer from Gun Violence Safe storage, firearms out of sensitive places, prevention programs.	
8	Restoring Focus with Personal Electronic Devices Off and Away for the Day Phones off and away from first bell to last, with local control over how.
